Women often become heads of households, men are more likely to face conscription, threats to their life or detention and both women and men face the threat of sexual violence as a weapon of war.

Anna Griffin (NSW IHL Coordinator, Australian Red Cross) will speak about the International Red Cross Red Crescent Movement's priorities and experiences

Sally-Anne Vincent (Director, DFAT) will speak about her experiences with gender and IHL as Australia's Head of Aid in Afghanistan
