About endometriosis

Endometriosis affects 10% of menstruating women. Endometriosis significantly impacts women's quality of life and can cause infertility, chronic debilitating pain, limited productivity and can exhaust the sufferers' emotional and financial resources.

Despite these enormous impacts, endometriosis is poorly known and poorly understood.

About *Life with Endometriosis*

Margaret Kalms is using photography to raise awareness of endometriosis by imaging the experiences of women living with endometriosis. *Life with Endometriosis* will:

- Raise awareness of endometriosis by making endometriosis visible.
- Present talks and slide shows at functions.
- Exhibit Margaret's art photographs in galleries in Australia, online and overseas.
- Invite local and international artists with endometriosis to exhibit with *Life with Endometriosis*.
- Publish an art book about the exhibition/collection.
- Raise funds by donating 10% of sales from exhibitions & book to endometriosis research.

Would you like to express your experiences through art?

Use your experiences as inspiration. Create art that expresses your life with endometriosis. Show how it feels or impacts on your life.

You may choose to display artwork at the workshop exhibition held on 11 December.
Selected artworks may be included in the '*Life with Endometriosis*' exhibition.

If you wish, you may remain anonymous, or use a pseudonym and not be visually identified in any promotional materials; if this is your choice, you must let Margaret or Susan know your wishes.
