She will address the systematic denial of rights in the constant battle with governments, and explain why self-determination is more important now than ever.



Antoinette Braybrook is an Aboriginal woman who was born on Wurundjeri country. Her grandfather and mother's line is through the Kuku Yalanji.

Antoinette is the CEO of Djirra, an Aboriginal Community Controlled Organization which provides holistic, culturally safe and specialist legal and non-legal support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who experience family violence – predominantly women. Djirra also designs and delivers important, communitybased early intervention and prevention programs and undertakes policy and law reform work to improve access to justice, strengthening Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women's resilience and reducing vulnerability to violence.
